## Threat Assessments and Plans

Port Facility Security Assessment (PFSA): The PFSA includes a real-time threat assessment and an on-site Port Facility Security Assessment. To comply with ISPS requirements, the PFSA must be performed for each facility. It is the basis for the Port Facility Security Plan.

Port Facility Security Plan (PFSP): The PFSP establishes how the facility will comply with the ISPS Code. In particular it establishes the position of a Port Facility Security Officer (PFSO) and identifies the processes and procedures to be followed. The PFSP is submitted for approval to the Port State's government.

## Training

Port Facility Security Officer and Personnel Training Courses: HudsonTrident offers training to provide port personnel with the appropriate security knowledge base. We also offer specialized qualification courses to meet the requirements of the ISPS Code.

## The Team
